Exome Sequencing in Diverse Populations in Colorado and Oregon

The Cancer Health Assessments Reaching Many (CHARM) study is one of six projects funded by a research consortium investigating ways to reduce health disparities from differences in understanding and use of genomic services. Principal Investigators: Ben Wilfond and Katrina Goddard. By addressing gaps in clinicians’ and patients’ knowledge of exome sequencing technology in the context of a well-established indication for genomic medicine (hereditary cancer syndromes), we hope to better understand the needs of clinicians and patients, and to support more equitable use of exome sequencing for future indications. Denver Health is one of five institutions partnering on this project, and one of the two recruitment sites.
