CLINICAL ACTIVITIES

Clinical Focus

I am a reproductive psychiatrist, specializing in the treatment of women with mood and anxiety disorders related to reproductive transitions. I evaluate and treat women with premenstrual and perimenopausal mood and anxiety disorders. Most of my clinical work focuses on treating psychiatric disorders among perinatal women and women with Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS). I conduct pre-pregnancy consultations as well as evaluate and treat women presenting with mood and anxiety symptoms related to pregnancy, postpartum, premenstrual, perimenopause and post-breast cancer transitions.

In addition to my outpatient work, I previously attend for two months of the year on the mood disorder services (typically with a treatment resistant disease population) and have also served on a dedicated consult service in obstetrics. As the Clinical and Education Director of the Reproductive Mental Health Center, I supervised 13 residents in a year-long reproductive mental health resident clinic as well as the clinical activities of a junior assistant professor, clinical psychologist, social worker, and nurse practitioner.

Clinical (Services) Responsibilities

2016- 2018 Primary responsibility for 12-18 outpatients with varying primary psychiatric disorders in the JHH Psychiatry Residents Clinic.

I also provided emergency consultative services to the inpatient obstetric units. Completed weekly psychiatric evaluations and expertise consultation in perinatal psychiatry and help oversee our clinic's nurse practitioner.

Clinical Productivity

Between our reproductive mental health resident clinic and my individual outpatient practice, I directly manage or oversee the care for approximately 200 patients. In fiscal year 2021-2022, and despite a 3-month maternity leave, I was in the top 100 doctors across Johns Hopkins Hospital for most telehealth visits. I also supervise our nurse practitioner, who individually follows over 200 patients, as well as two psychotherapists (a psychologist and a social worker). Our clinic receives almost 500 referrals and sees approximately 5,000 follow-ups per year. I provide individual supervision on a weekly basis to all clinicians.

Clinical Program Building / Leadership

- 2016-2017 Administrative Resident – recruited, interviewed, and matched potential patients for admission to the Psychiatry Residents Outpatient Clinic. Completed administrative meetings to help improve efficiency and safety of referral process.
- 2020-2022 Assistant Director of the Reproductive Mental Health Center and Resident Education. In my two years as assistant director, I redesigned the clinical focus and didactic seminar series for our weekly resident clinic.
- 2022- 2024 Clinical and Education Director of the Reproductive Mental Health Center. Since assuming this role, I have restructured our care mode to provide time limited (pre-pregnancy, pregnancy and up to one year postpartum) evidence based clinical care to improve patient access to our specialty services.
- 2022- 2024 Service Line Leader, Inpatient Brexanolone Service. I personally evaluate all patient referrals and conduct brief psychiatric assessments to ensure eligibility for inpatient Brexanolone treatment, as well as oversee Brexanolone admissions on two of our psychiatric inpatient units. I lead a monthly meeting with nursing, pharmacy, and administrative leadership to ensure protocol adherence and coordinate patient admissions.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Educational Focus

In addition to participating in the general didactics for our department's residents, teaching 3rd year medical students rotating through their mental health elective during their OB/GYN rotation, I also designed and teach a year-long weekly course on the diagnosis, medical management, and psychological treatment of reproductive mental health disorders. The result of these efforts led to one of my proudest accomplishments; I received the Phipps Resident Teaching Award – an honor bestowed to one faculty member per year and is selected by faculty and residents across the department. I have also been invited to national talks where I teach advanced psychiatric practitioners and fellow physicians the clinical approach, diagnosis, and treatment of reproductive psychiatric disorders. In 2021, I was elected to the educational board of the National Curriculum on Reproductive Psychiatry (NCRP), where I serve on two committees: one where I co-designed and co-lead the first-ever virtual fellows' series, and the second organizing the first-ever yearly advanced training conference using the NCRP.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Research Focus

I perform clinical research on the biological mechanisms of and treatments for mood and anxiety disorders. Studies I have worked on focus on the connection between reproductive hormonal changes (or neuroactive steroids) and perinatal mood and anxiety symptoms and medication management. I am also working to understand how the alterations in sex steroids observed in women with PCOS (i.e., increased androgen steroids and changes in the progesterone metabolite pathway) may affect the increased rates of psychiatric disorders observed in women with PCOS. Due to my national reputation on PCOS and mental health, I was invited to serve on the advisory board for a PCORI grant called the COMET PCOS Clinical Trial by PI: Anuja Dokras at University of Pennsylvania

Lastly, I am very interested in collaborative and integrated care models as a means of providing consultation and education for my OB/GYN colleagues in the management of reproductive psychiatric disorders and working to expand care to previously underserved populations. As a result, I recently supervised my mentee, Dr. Marissa Beal, in submitting and receiving a grant from the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) grant to improve equity of care in perinatal mental health in our previously established integrated care clinics.
