Professional Experience:

Chief Medical Officer, Denver Health and Hospital, Denver, CO 2015 – Present

I provide strategic leadership, foster partnerships, facilitate technology adoption, optimize clinical efficiencies, and nurture critical relationships while ensuring success of our academic mission for a multispecialty provider group that sees 1.2 million total patient visits per year. I have oversight of the medical staff office, its 1700 provider members, and payer contracting and enrollment. Denver Health is an \$1.3 billion (net position) integrated urban safety net health system comprised of a 555-bed hospital, 10 health centers, 19 school-based clinics, 4 urgent cares, and a level one trauma center with a renown emergency department seeing 208,000+ visits per year, in addition to housing its own medical plan, call center, public health institute, and 911 response for the city.

Key Achievements:

- Redesigned the medical staff structure at Denver Health to enhance engagement. Before 2015, the medical staff executive committee was comprised only of appointed department directors, without a formal credentialing committee or a peer review committee. Together with other physician executives, I revised the bylaws to create a wholly elected medical staff that was among the nation's first to include advanced practice professionals as members.
 - Created a credentialing committee that reviews "red flags" identified by the medical staff office. Files are reviewed and vetted in a compliant and structured manner by a committee of peers.
 - Created a peer review committee that reviews cases submitted by hospital risk management, compliance, or department heads when there is concern about medical care by a specific physician or provider (versus systems-related issues).
- Founded the Medical Necessity Committee to better steward our charity care dollars at Denver Health. Formed a volunteer multi-disciplinary physician committee to review requests for highcost elective charity care. Developed an electronic process for our physicians to request and for our committee the review cases of greatest need through our electronic medical record. This efficient process is estimated to have saved hundreds of thousands in excess uncompensated procedure-related costs each year, while still upholding Denver Health's mission.
- Reduced Out of County Uncompensated Care Costs. In January 2023, tasked by CEO to address
 the spiraling costs of uncompensated care provided to patients who reside outside our service
 area. Since my launch of the initiative, our cost of uncompensated care to non-Denver County
 residents has decreased \$6 million versus prior year, which is the only decrease in
 uncompensated care recorded in our recent history (except for the 2020 during pandemic
 shutdowns).
- Established Provider Productivity Benchmarking at Denver Health. Developed a process to benchmark physician (both employed and contracting) and provider productivity. When I first reported data, only 10% of our departments functioned at target benchmarks. During my tenure, using the data to inform hiring and/or contracting decisions, >85% of our departments are now functioning at their target benchmarks (MGMA).
- Formed an Advanced Practice Provider (APP) Council to ensure our APPs a platform for peer support, mentoring, and decision-making. With a workforce that has grown to comprise 40% of our medical staff, improving their engagement within the organization through this platform has proven essential.
- Led large regional initiatives for disaster preparedness. My leadership in acquiring and advancing two large federally funded programs overseeing preparedness for HHS Region VIII is a testament to my ability to forge relationships and guide diverse stakeholders within complex technical and policy landscapes.
- Key medical leader for state and local public health during the COVID-19 pandemic. With my team, led the administration of 297,624 COVID vaccinations to 156,238 people during the first year of the pandemic, largely to Denver's poorest and most disadvantaged neighborhoods; the only CO hospital to partner with the U.S. Military to administer monoclonal antibody treatments that help keep COVID patients out of the hospital; collaborated to create our virtual hospital at home program, allowing us to care for more patients when COVID numbers were surging; the first in CO to make a lab test for COVID-19 available in 2021.
